Fruit Cake.

200gm/8oz 100gm/4oz 25gm/1oz 50gm/2oz

Self-Raising Flour Butter or Margarine Chopped Mixed peel Currants

50gm/2oz Sultanas 100gm/4oz Sugar 2 Eggs (Beaten) Pinch of Salt Milk to mix

Line a 7 inch Cake tin.

Rub the fat into the flour and salt until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar, fruit and peel. Make a well in the centre, pour in the egg and some of the milk and gradually work in the dry ingredients adding more milk if necessary to give a dropping consistency. Put the mixture into the tin and level the top. Bake in the centre of the oven at 180°c / 350°f / Mark 4 for about 1 hour until the cake is golden brown and firm to the touch.
