## Tangy Lemon Cake.

$100 \mathrm{gm} / 4 \mathrm{oz}$ Butter
Grated rind and juice of 2 lemons
$150 \mathrm{gm} / 6$ oz Self-Raising Flour
50 gm/2oz
Granulated Sugar

1. Cream butter, caster sugar and lemon rind until fluffy
2. Gradually beat in eggs.
3. Mix in flour and add about 4 tablespoons of milk to soften mixture. It should be soft enough to drop off the end of a spoon when shaken gently.
4. Grease a 1 lb loaf tin.
5. Bake in a moderate oven Gas Mk $4180^{\circ} \mathrm{C} / 350^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ for 45 to 50 minutes until risen and golden, firm on top and shrinking from sides of tin.
6. Just before cake is ready to come out of oven, prepare the lemon syrup. Heat lemon juice and granulated sugar gently until sugar is dissolved.
7. As soon as cake is out of the oven, while still in tin, pierce top all over. Pour over the lemon syrup. Leave cake in tin until cold.
