Rules and Conditions

1. Entries in an **Amateur Sections** of both shows are restricted to those exhibitors who are not and have not been professionals in that section.
2. Any objection raised as to the qualification of an exhibitor shall be dealt with by the Flower Show Committee and its decision shall be final.
3. **All Exhibits** must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least **Two months**, except in the Domestic Section and where stated.
4. **All entries** should be submitted on the relevant entry forms. Entries for the **Spring Show** will only be accepted on the day of the show from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Entry forms for the **Summer Show** should be submitted to the Flower Show Secretary, together with the entrance money, not later than **Thursday 11th August 2005**. Entries will be accepted up until 11.00 a.m. on the day of the show but **entry fee will be doubled**.
5. Entry fees will be 15p for all classes.
6. The Hall will be open from 9-00 a.m. to 11-00 a.m. and **no** entries will be accepted after this time.
7. One entry per person in any one class.
8. Exhibits are not to be removed from the tables before the Prize-giving.
9. The Flower Show Committee will not be held responsible for any damage that may occur to the exhibits.
10. All cup winners to hold trophy for **eleven months**. All cups **must** be returned to the Show Secretary **one month** before the Show.
11. Prizes : 1st - 30p 2nd - 25p 3rd - 20p
12. The judges are empowered to withhold any award at their discretion.

Easter Biscuits

Spring Show No. 24

Ingredients:

3 oz	Butter/Margarine	1½oz	Currants
2½oz	Caster Sugar	½ oz	Mixed Peel, chopped
1	Egg, separated	1-2	Tbsps Milk or Brandy
6 oz	Self Raising Flour	A little	Caster Sugar
	Pinch of Salt		

Method

1. Cream butter and sugar beat in the egg yolk.
2. Sift the flour and salt; fold into the creamed mixture with the currants and mixed peel.
3. Add enough milk/brandy to give a fairly soft dough, cover, leave in a cold place to become firm.
4. Knead lightly on a floured board, roll out ¼" thick.
5. Cut into rounds using a fluted cutter, about 2½" diameter.
6. Place on greased trays and bake in a preheated oven 200°C/ 400°F/ Gas Mark 6 for about 20 mins until lightly coloured: after 10 mins baking, brush the biscuits with slightly whisked egg white and sprinkle with sugar, continue cooking.

Homity Pie

Spring Show No. 26

Ingredients:

¾ lb	Potatoes	4 oz	Cheese - grated
1 lb	Onions	3 tbs	Oil
1 oz	Butter of Margarine	1 tbsp	Milk
½oz	Parsley – chopped	Salt & Pepper	
2	Garlic Cloves – crushed		
8 oz	Wholemeal Pastry		

Method

1. Roll out pastry and line a 7"-8" flan dish.
2. Boil or steam potatoes until tender
3. Chop onions then sauté in oil until soft.
4. Combine potatoes and onions; add butter/margarine, parsley, 2oz cheese, garlic, milk and season to taste, cool.
5. Fill pastry case with filling, sprinkle with remaining cheese.
6. Bake in a preheated oven 220°C/425°/Gas Mark 7 for 20 mins

Date Slices

Summer Show No 33.

Ingredients:

8oz Porridge Oats
6oz Wholemeal Flour
4oz Sugar
6oz Butter/Margarine

Filling:
12oz Stoned Dates
6fl oz Water
1oz Sugar

Method:

1. Make filling, chop dates and put into a saucepan with water and sugar, cook gently until it resembles a paste. Leave to cool.
2. Mix oats, flour and sugar, rub in butter until crumbly.
3. Put half this mixture into a greased Swiss roll tin, patting firmly down.
4. Spread with date paste.
5. Cover with remaining crumble mixture, pat down gently.
6. Bake at 180°/350°F/Gas Mark 4 for 20-25 minutes.
7. Cut into slices while still warm.

Scrunch Squares

Summer Show No. 34

Ingredients:

4oz Butter/Margarine
2oz Sugar
2oz Porridge Oats
1½ Tbs Golden Syrup

2oz Desiccated Coconut
2oz Cornflakes
2oz Self Raising Flour

Method

1. Melt the fat, sugar and syrup, remove from heat.
2. Add coconut, cornflakes, porridge oats and flour.
3. Beat all ingredients together and press into a greased Swiss roll tin.
4. Bake in a preheated oven 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4 for 20 mins.
5. Cut into squares while still warm.

Madiera Cake

Summer Show No.35

Ingredients:

6oz Butter or Hard Margarine	3 Eggs
6oz Sugar	Grated Rind of 1 Lemon
2 Level tsps Baking Powder	2 tpls Milk
8oz Plain Flour	

Method:

1. Line a round cake tin, about 7".
2. Sieve the flour and baking powder.
3. Cream together sugar and margarine/butter until light and fluffy, adding grated rind.
4. Beat in eggs one at a time, adding a little flour mixture each time.
5. Fold in the rest of flour then the milk.
6. Put into prepared tin and smooth top.
7. Bake in a preheated oven at 170°/335°F/Gas Mark 3 for 1½ - 1¾ hours.
