Date and Walnut Cake

100g Walnuts 250g Dates

100g Dark soft brown sugar 50g Butter

1 medium egg, beaten 1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of

soda

200g Self raising flour

Method

- Chop Walnuts and Dates
- Place into a large bowl with the sugar and butter.
- Pour 250ml boiling water into a jug and add bicarbonate of soda.
- Pour over mixture in the bowl and mix until fairly smooth.
- Mix in the beaten egg, gently stir in the flour.
- Place the mixture into a 1 lb. (8"x4") lined loaf tin and bake at Gas mark 2 (150C, 300F) for about 50 minutes.
- Leave in the tin for about 10 minutes and transfer to a wire rack to cool.

Rules and Conditions

- Entries in Amateur Sections of both shows are restricted to those exhibitors who are not and have not been professionals in that section. Exhibitors must be AMATEURS in their Class.
- 2. Any objection raised as to the qualification of an exhibitor shall be dealt with by the Flower Show Committee and its decision shall be final.
- 3. **All Pot Plants** must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least **Six months**, All other exhibits for at least Two months, except in the Domestic Section and where stated.
- 4. All entries should be submitted on the relevant entry forms. Entries for the Spring Show will only be accepted on the day of the show from 9 am to 10.30 am Entry forms for the Summer Show should be submitted to the Flower Show Secretary, together with the entrance money, not later than 3 pm on Friday 3rd August 2011. Entries will be accepted on the day of the show but the entry fee will then be 30p and must be staged by 10.30 am
- 5. Entry fees will be 20p for all classes.
- The Hall will be open from 9-00 a.m. to 10-30 a.m. and no entries will be accepted after this time.
- 7. One entry per person in any one class.
- Exhibits are not to be removed from the tables before the Prizegiving.
- 9. The Flower Show Committee will not be held responsible for any damage that may occur to the exhibits.

Cheesy Oat Savouries

Item 26 Spring Show Domestic Section.

75g Self raising Flour 75g Butter

½ teaspoon mustard powder 150g Strong Cheddar cheese

50g porridge oats 3 tablespoons milk

Method

- Preheat oven to Gas Mark 7 (220°C, 425°F)
- Mix flour, oats and mustard, rub in the butter
- Add the cheese and mix to a stiff dough with the milk.
- Knead lightly, roll out and cut into fingers.
- Place on a baking tray and bake for 10-12 minutes until golden and crisp.
- Cool on a wire rack and store in an airtight tin.

Banana Loaf

Item 27 Spring Show Domestic Section

250g Self Raising Flour Pinch Salt

100g Unsalted butter cut into 125g Light muscovado sugar

small pieces

2 ripe bananas 100g Raisins

1 dessertspoon Demerara sugar 1egg lightly beaten

Method

- Grease and line a 2lb (9"x5") loaf tin
- Preheat oven to Gas Mark 4 (180°C/350°F)
- Sift flour and salt into large mixing bowl and rub in the butter until mixture resembles breadcrumbs.
- Add the sugar and raisins, mix lightly and make a well in the centre.
- In another bowl, mash the bananas, add the egg.
- Mix with a wooden spoon until thoroughly combined.
- Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin and sprinkle over the Demerara sugar.
- Bake for about 45 minutes until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.
- Leave in the tin for 10 minutes to cool before turning out.
- It keeps for up to 5 days in an airtight tin and freezes well.
