## Gingerbread.

| $200 \mathrm{gm} / 8 \mathrm{oz}$ | Plain Flour | $2 \times 5 \mathrm{ml}$ spoons/2 tsp Ground Ginger |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| $100 \mathrm{gm} / 40 \mathrm{z}$ | Margarine | $1 \times 5 \mathrm{ml} \mathrm{spoon} / 1 \mathrm{tsp}$ Mixed Spice |
| $50 \mathrm{gm} / 20 \mathrm{z}$ | Soft Brown Sugar | $125 \mathrm{ml} / 1 / 4 \mathrm{pt}$ Milk |
| $150 \mathrm{gm} / 6 \mathrm{oz}$ | Black Treacle | 2 Eggs (Beaten) |
| $50 \mathrm{gm} / 2 \mathrm{z}$ | Golden Syrup | Pinch of Salt |

## $1 \times 5 \mathrm{ml}$ spoon/1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda

1. Sieve together flour, salt, ginger, spice and bicarbonate of soda. Stir in sugar.
2. Melt Margarine, treacle and syrup gently.
3. Gradually beat in milk. Allow to cool. Add eggs.
4. Stir treacle mixture into flour etc.
5. Pour into a greased $18 \mathrm{~cm} / 7^{\prime \prime}$ square cake tin.
6. Bake in a slow oven $150^{\circ} \mathrm{C} / 300^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ Gas Mark 2 for about $11 / 4$ hours

## Rules and conditions

1. Entries in an Amateur Section are restricted to those exhibitors who are not and have not been professionals in that section.
2. Any objection raised as to the qualification of an exhibitor shall be dealt with by the Flower Show Committee and its decision shall be final.
3. All Exhibits must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least Two months, except in the Domestic Section and where stated.
4. All entries should be sent to the Show Secretary with exhibitors names and classes entered on a sheet of paper with the entrance money not later than Thursday 10th August 1995. Entries will be accepted up until 11.15 a.m. on the day of the show but entry fee will be doubled.
5. Entry fees will be $15 p$ for all classes.
6. The Hall will be open from 9-15 a.m. to 11-15 a.m. and no entries will be accepted after this time.
7. One entry per person in any one class.
8. Exhibits are not to be removed from the tables before the Prize-giving.
9. The Flower Show Committee will not be held responsible for any damage that may occur to the exhibits.
10. All cup winners to hold trophy for eleven months. All cups must be returned to the Show Secretary one month before the Show.
11. Prizes: 1st-30p 2nd-25p 3rd-20p
12. The judges are empowered to withhold any award at their discretion.
