50gm/2oz	Soft Brown Sugar	125ml / 1/4pt Milk
150gm/6oz	Black Treacle	2 Eggs (Beaten)
50gm/2oz	Golden Syrup	Pinch of Salt
1 v 5ml enoun/1 ten Ricarhonate of Soda		

- 1 x 5ml spoon/1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda
- 1. Sieve together flour, salt, ginger, spice and bicarbonate of soda. Stir in sugar.
