8oz plain flour

2 oz Caster sugar

Pinch salt

1 tsp orange zest

1 tbsp baking powder.

2 eggs beaten

4 oz butter

3 tbsp orange marmalade

2 - 3 tbsp fresh milk

Prepare a 1 lb loaf tin.

Sift flour, salt and baking powder into a bowl.

Rub in butter finely. Add sugar and orange zest.

Mix to a fairly soft batter with eggs, marmalade and milk.

Transfer to prepared tin and bake at 180°c (350°f) Gas mark 4 for 1½ to 1½ hours or until a wooden cocktail stick, inserted into centre, comes out clean.

Leave in tin for 5 minutes, turn out onto wire cooling rack and peel off paper.

Store in an airtight container when cold.

Mock Chelsea Buns

| Dough Mixture | Filling |
|------------------------|------------------------------|
| 8oz Self Raising Flour | 1 oz butter |
| 3 oz Butter | 5 oz mixed fruit |
| 1 oz Sugar | 2 oz Demerara sugar |
| 1/4 Pint fresh milk | 1 oz glace cherries, chopped |
| | 1 tsp mixed spice |

Dough: Sieve flour into a bowl and rub in butter until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.

Add sugar and mix in milk to give a soft dough.

Filling: Melt Butter and stir in mixed fruit, Demerara sugar, cherries and spice, mix well.

Method:

Roll out dough on a floured work surface to 10 x 12 inches.

Sprinkle Filling over dough to within $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of edge. Dampen edges of dough with water.

Starting from longer edge, roll up and cut into 8.

Place cut sides down on a greased baking tray and bake at 200°c (400°f) Mark 6 for 15 to 20 minutes.
