## Easy Shortbread Biscuits. Ingredients

- $125 \mathrm{~g} / 4 \mathrm{oz}$ butter
- $55 \mathrm{~g} / 2 \mathrm{oz}$ caster sugar plus extra to finish
- $180 \mathrm{~g} / 6 \mathrm{oz}$ plain flour


## Method

1. Heat the oven to $190^{\circ} \mathrm{c} / 375^{\circ} \mathrm{f} /$ Gas mk 5 .
2. Beat the butter and the sugar together until smooth.
3. Stir in the flour to get a smooth paste.
4. Turn out onto a floured surface and gently roll out until the paste is $1 \mathrm{~cm} / 1 / 2$ in thick.
5. Cut out, using a cutter of your choice, and place on a greased baking tray.
6. Sprinkle with caster sugar and chill in the fridge for 20 minutes.
7. Bake in the oven for $15-20$ minutes or until pale golden brown.
8. Set aside to cool on a wire rack.

1. Entries in all sections are open to everyone, including children. Exhibitors must all be AMATEURS.
2. Any objection raised as to the qualification of an exhibitor shall be dealt with by the Show Committee and its decision shall be final.
3. All Pot Plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least Six months, All other exhibits for at least two months, except in the Domestic Section and where stated.
4. All entries should be submitted on the relevant entry forms.

Entries for the Spring and Summer Shows will only be accepted on the day of the show from 9 am to 10:30 am.
Entries must be staged by 10:30 am.
5. Entry fees will be 25 p for all classes.
6. The Hall will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and no entries will be accepted after this time.
7. One entry per person in any one class.
8. Exhibits are not to be removed from the tables before the Prizegiving at 16:00.
9. The Show Committee will not be held responsible for any damage that may occur to the exhibits.
10. All cup winners to hold trophy for eleven months. All cups must be returned to the Show Secretary one month before the Show.
11. Prizes: $1^{\text {st }}-30 p 2^{\text {nd }}-25 p 3^{\text {rd }}-20 p$.
12. The judges are empowered to withhold any award at their discretion.

## Helpful Hints

- Dahlias. Blooms should face the front, preferably with some foliage on the stem, and no buds.
- Gladioli. Erect spike with fresh, unblemished blooms, ideally one third in full flower, one third with buds in colour and one third with green bud.
- Roses. Should only have one bloom per stem, whether for scent or the vase of two roses.
- Peas \& Beans. (In their pods) Pods should be cut with a short stalk and be uniform in size, colour and maturity.
- Onions. Tops neatly tied and trimmed. Do not remove too much of the outer skin. Sand may be used to display.
- $\quad$ Rhubarb. Fresh with heel still on, leaf trimmed to approx. 7.5 cm .
- Tomatoes. Rich colour with fresh calyx and stalk intact.
- Potatoes. Medium sized ( $175 \mathrm{~g}-225 \mathrm{~g}$ ) uniform shape, clean skin (never scrub the skin).
- Courgettes. Young, uniform shape and colour, length approx. 15 cm , with or without flowers.
- Culinary Herbs. Fresh, healthy clean leaves with no sign of disease or age.
- Carrots. Must have their leaves cut off, leaving approx. 7.5 cm of stalk.
- Currants. Sprigs with full complement of ripe currants stalks fresh and intact.
- Berries. Ripe with no blemishes, with green stalks and calyx attached.
